

Curriculum Newsletter Autumn Term 1 2025-26

Literacy: In our writing journeys we will study:

- Diary entries
- Setting descriptions
- Newspaper articles

Our key text for this term will be Kensuke's Kingdom by Michael Morpurgo.

Numeracy: We will begin the term by developing our place value knowledge for numbers up to 10 million. We will develop our knowledge of rounding and negative numbers. We will study the four operations and continue to develop our reasoning and problem-solving abilities. We will also be looking at prime, square and cube numbers.

Computing: We will be studying Bletchley Park and secret codes. We will create information websites about Bletchley and presentations on figures from the history of computing.

Extra-curricular activities: We will be running a survival themed day. The day will include: learning how to source water, how to construct a shelter and how to build and ignite a fire.

Year 6

Unit: How will I survive?

Science: We will be studying light. We will aim to recognise that light travels in straight lines, and how this connects with how we are able to see. We will look at shadows and why they are the same shape as the object that casts them.

Wider Curriculum: In History and Geography we will study the Mayan civilisation. We will learn about how the location and environment in which the civilisation grew affected their religious beliefs, diet and farming. We will use and evaluate a range of sources, deciding which can be seen as reliable and which may not be. We will compare maps of modern-day Central America with maps of the Mayan civilisation, looking at both human and physical features. In art we will be explore the techniques used and appraise the work of Jerry Clovis. In music we will be learning how to play the ukulele. In our new language: Spanish- we will be learning about phonetics and the use of key vocabulary.

Spelling homework will be sent out on a **Monday** afternoon and maths homework will also be sent out on a **Friday** afternoon. Homework may be returned up to the following Monday/Friday. Please ensure that your child is reading for 15/20 minutes every day and recording this in their reading record. Please also ensure your child is continuing to practice their times tables.
